MONTHLY REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 2019 SUBMITTED BY DISTRICT LEVEL SPECIAL TASK FORCE

The 17th Meeting of District Level Special Task Force was held on 27.12.2019 under the Chairmanship of Ms. Najuk Kumar, IAS, SDM (Central), U.T., Chandigarh, in D.C. Office, Chandigarh to discuss the action taken to control the pollution in river Ghaggar.

1) Status of tenders w.r.t. upgradation of STPs and construction of new STPs.

Sh. Vivek Pandey, Scientist B, CPCC informed that as per the order of Hon'ble NGT dated 22.11.2019, all the concerned States/UT relevant for River Ghaggar must ensure installation of STPs within the planned timelines subject to the rider that where the timelines goes beyond 31.12.2020, the timeline will be treated to be 31.12.2020. Wherever timeline already laid down by the State/UT is exceeded, compensation will be payable @ Rs 10 lakh/month per STP till commissioning of STPs. This scale of compensation will also apply, in respect of STPs for which timeline for construction of STP is beyond 31.12.2020, from 01.01.2021.

Sh. Gagandeep Singh, Manager, Chandigarh Smart City Limited, informed that two bids were received by Chandigarh Smart City Limited for up gradation of existing STPs and construction of new STP. Technical evaluation of bids has been completed but due to some issues, objections were raised in the house, now the matter is with the Hon'ble Administrator, U.T. Chandigarh.

2) As per the directions of Hon'ble NGT in the para no. 20 in its order dated 22.11.2019, steps should be taken for compliance of direction for connecting the drains to the STPs and till then in-situ remediation should be ensured.

Sh. Vivek Pandey, Scientist B, CPCC informed the MC that as per the order of Hon'ble NGT dated 22.11.2019, steps should be taken for compliance of direction for connecting the drains to the STPs and till then in-situ remediation should be ensured.

Ms. Najuk Kumar directed MC to take steps w.r.t. in-situ remediation.

3) Status of plugging of various points of Sukhna choe and N-choe.

Sh. Vivek Pandey informed the committee that many points discharging wastewater into the drains have been plugged. Status of all the discharge points of Sukhna Choe and N-

Choe were discussed. Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh provided the status of discharge of untreated waste water in N-Choe, Sukhna choe and Faida choe which is as given below:

4) Status of health check up camps

Ms. Shobhna Pathania, Nodal Officer, Health Department informed that the health checks up camps are being organized regularly. She further informed that they have discussed the matter of organizing the health check up camps with Hon'ble Justice Pritam Pal, Chairman of Executive Committee and he agreed to organize health camps on quarterly basis as Chandigarh has good no. of dispensaries in all the areas.

5) Regular inspection of industries by CPCC so as to take action against the defaulting units.

Sh. Vivek Pandey informed the committee that inspections of industries are being done regularly and actions are being taken as per the findings. He informed that DLSTF has inspected 8 units in the month of December, 2019 and actions have been initiated against the violating units.
