Earlier keeping animals/cattle at home for dairy, daily needs and domestic help in agriculture and transportation was considered a proud matter, however the scenario has completely changed now a days with the problem of vacant land spaces, unavailability of pastures, advancement in technology, machinery, economic resources and living status. Resultantly, this passion has now been limited to the villages and the peripheral areas of the cities in India and became one of the profitable but hard food business.

Being a vital part of our food chain and growing interest for more profitable business around cities, animals too need to have improvement in intensive care practices, food stuff refinement, breed improvement and health care facilities. This leads to the development of another branch of agriculture, concerned with animals that are raised for meat, fibre, milk, eggs, or other products & called as Animal Husbandry.



The city beautiful "Chandigarh", with a population of more than 10.55 lakh (census 2011) has huge consumption of milk, dairy products, eggs and meat, daily. All the supplies are met by different suppliers based around the city and adjoining areas. Being a planned modern city, Chandigarh does not have space for dairy and poultry farms in between residential sectors; however there are separate markets/shops available for the sale of raw meat/chicken. #### Livestock Category and Population in Chandigarh

Daily supply of milk, eggs and meat of the city residents met primarily from these areas. 
#### Animals: Milk and Milch, Chandigarh

Given below is the table showing the number of animals (Cow, Cross Breed Cow & Buffalo) being engaged in producing milk and the number of milching animals present in Chandigarh (UT) area. Milching animals are the same domestic animals that can yield milk or are suitable for milk production, but not yielding presently due to their age or other natural reasons. Data indicates that the number of buffaloes are quite higher in the U.T., Chandigarh as compared to the number of cows. As per statistical abstract of Chandigarh-2013-14, there were 600 cows in feeding the city compared to the 14000 buffaloes.




